#### Recommended Sequencing Plan

Below is a sample sequence of courses for your degree. If you follow this plan, you should be able to graduate in two years. This is just one example of how you could complete your major and degree requirements; you may find that a different sequence works as well.

Part-time completion of the 60-credit after-degree program is also possible.
